A Life Transformed....

My name is Mike H. and I was born in Gulfport, MI in 1980. Born into a broken family, I was mostly raised by my grandmother and mother. My father was from Honduras and he left my mother when I was only a baby. I've never met him to this day. We left Mississippi for North Carolina hoping for a fresh start but it did not turn out so well. My mom had to work a lot so I had a neighborhood babysitter. And there my real life nightmare would begin. I was sexually molested for a period of about one year and was threatened with my life if I told. Terrified and confused, I never said a word to anyone for 21 years. I would return from the babysitters to a house where my mom and I were beaten daily for many years. I did not understand how someone could say they love me while trying to destroy me. So as I began my teenage years, the only comfort I found in my life was my grandmother. I took refuge in her and she loved me and nurtured me. She was my best friend in the whole world and when I was 14 years old, she died. My world completely fell apart. By this time my mother had developed addictions because of all the mental and physical abuse and as for me, well, I cursed God. At my grandma's funeral I will never forget the words I spoke while gazing up at the sky in the parking lot. I told God I would never have anything to do with Him and a deep bitterness captured my heart. For the next 15 years I ran with all my might to some of the darkest places that a man could go. The world could not supply what I needed to relieve myself from myself. Many failed suicide attempts, overdoses, prison, institutions and countless broken relationships including one with my own son, I finally cried out of the depths of my black, scarred and hardened heart for a God that I knew nothing about to rescue me!



Faithful and true is He who delivers the sinner from the snares of death. God answered my cry, cleared my mind and healed my broken heart. All of my life I had been seeking the purpose of my life and then God showed me my identity rested in Him and that He chose me before the foundations of the earth to be saved. II Corinthians 5:17 states: "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature, old things have passed away, behold all things are become new." God applied his grace to me to let go of the old man and He offered me a cross to bear. Forgetting that which is behind me, I am able to press towards the prize which is Christ Jesus. Today my desire is to know Him and the fellowship of His sufferings. Through God's mercy, He brought me to Dare Challenge, a place of refuge and safety, that I might establish a firm relationship with Jesus Christ. God has settled my heart with His peace that passes all understanding and has placed an honorable burden upon me to walk in the light of the gospel, in service to God through Jesus Christ by the Spirit of God. Through His grace I now stand on the promises for all His children and am persuaded that He will keep me and finish the work that He has started in me until Christ comes to take me home.
